- Develop an enthusiasm for plant conservation
- Learn about botany related organizations and services

Who will attend?

The symposium is attended by plant enthusiasts from all walks of life including professional and amateur botanists, researchers, educators, students, consultants, land managers, non-profit organizations, and state and federal agencies in the region.
